There are several levels of sponsorship.


Full Sponsorship: \$60/month (\$720/year)

Half Sponsorship: \$30/month (\$360/year)

Third Sponsorship: \$20/ month (\$240/year)

You may also choose to make a one time donation in any amount.

NOTE: You may notice that other child sponsorship programs ask for a \$25 - \$30 per month gift to fully sponsor a child. Keep in mind that this provides food and clothing for the child while your sponsorship with Samaritan Village provides a home as well.

Our History

Born From a Tragic Need



The founder of this incredible work is Elizabeth Mwalizi, a native of Tanzania, Africa.

While attending boarding school as a high school student in Tanzania, Elizabeth helped care for infants who were brought to a nearby hospital by parents who were unable to care for them. The number of babies being taken to the hospital was so overwhelming, the hospital could only provide care for them until the age of three or four. After that, the children had to be given back into the hands of relatives —relatives who themselves were poverty stricken and often near starvation.

Tragically, most of the infants died soon after being released to their families. Elizabeth was a witness to this horror.

God placed a burden for these children on Elizabeth's heart. She decided to do her utmost to establish a permanent orphanage in Tanzania for abandoned and orphaned babies.

Elizabeth came to America in 1964 to further her education and received her BA degree from San Francisco State University in California. She later became a teacher.

Samaritan Village Begins

Elizabeth continued to share her story in her new home country, but it wasn't until she shared her story with a group of Christians in Yuba City, California in the early 1990's, that something was done to rescue these children. Thanks to the prayers and dedication of that small group of volunteers and another like-minded group of Believers in Arusha Tanzania, Samaritan Village Orphanage was created in 1992 and began caring for children in 1996.

With its goal of rescuing abandoned children and giving them a permanent home, the first objective has always been to find families who will adopt these children. In the past nearly thirty years, Samaritan Village has rescued over two hundred children. Most have been adopted by families from around the world. Those children not adopted are growing up at Samaritan Village. Through God's grace, these abandoned and orphaned children all have a place to call home.

Today, Samaritan Village is growing and currently cares for over 50 children in a permanent residence with a 24 hour staff to care for them. The orphanage provides each child with nutritious food, clothing, health care and education in a warm and loving Christian environment. Samaritan Village has its own chapel for daily worship and serves not only their own orphans, but also members of the community.



Samaritan Village's Future



Samaritan Village is continuing to expand in order to rescue more children and meet the diverse needs of the those in the surrounding community.

We just opened a three story medical clinic/dormitory that serves many of the health needs of the children and local community. The building also adds rooms for up to eighty more children.
