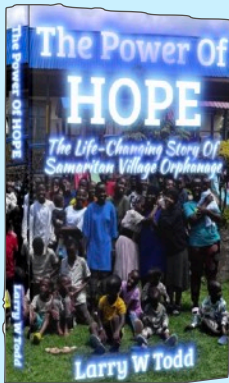

Our History

Born From a Tragic Need



The founder of this remarkable ministry is Elizabeth Mwalozi, a native of Tanzania, Africa. As a teenager, Elizabeth learned the heartbreaking truth of parents abandoning their babies because they were unable to care for them. Hundreds of babies each year were being left on the streets, in hospitals, fields, or even in garbage cans.

Elizabeth felt a profound calling from God to do everything in her power to establish a permanent orphanage in Tanzania—a safe, loving home for abandoned and orphaned children.

In 1964, Elizabeth came to the United States to further her education. She met and married, and then settled in Yuba City, California.

Samaritan Village Begins

Elizabeth often shared her story, but it wasn't until the early 1990s that a small group of Christians in Yuba City, California, decided to help these children by founding Samaritan Village Orphanage in 1996.

The mission has been clear: to rescue abandoned children and provide them with a permanent, loving Christian home. Over the past three decades, Samaritan Village has rescued more than 300 children. Most have been adopted by families. Those not adopted are raised at the orphanage, where, by God's grace, every child has a place to belong.



Samaritan Village Today

Today, Samaritan Village continues to grow and now provides a home for more than 70 children, **including those rescued from human trafficking**. A dedicated, around-the-clock staff ensures that each child receives nutritious meals, clothing, medical care, and a quality education within a warm, Christ-centered environment.



The orphanage also includes a chapel for daily worship, serving not only the children but also members of the surrounding community.

Our Future: A New Hospital

Samaritan Village is continuing to expand to rescue more children and meet the diverse needs of the community.

We opened a three-story medical clinic/dormitory in 2019 that serves many of the health needs of the children and the local community. The medical clinic offers 24/7 care from doctors and nurses, **including a doctor who grew up at Samaritan Village**. The clinic has a maternity ward and a pharmacy. The top floors add rooms for up to eighty more children.



We are currently raising funds to build a 50-bed hospital. The current building will then be used solely as a dorm.

The hospital will help prevent the deaths of orphans and others who cannot afford hospital treatment by offering free medical care.

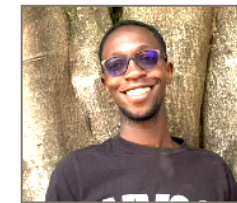
The Children

Here are just a few of the stories of the children who grew up at Samaritan Village.



Simon's mother died of HIV. He was taken care of by a convent until the age of two. He was then placed at Samaritan Village. **Simon** is now a **doctor** at a hospital in Arusha. He also works at our Samaritan Medical Clinic.

Anna was one of the first two babies brought to Samaritan Village in 1996. (The other child was adopted. Today, he lives in Germany with his wife and daughter.) **Anna** was abandoned by her mother, who left her with a neighbor and never returned. **Anna** just completed her law degree and is a practicing **attorney** in Tanzania.



Moses was the child of a prostitute who attempted to abort him through drugs but failed. Later, the child was found nailed inside a box. Authorities took him to Samaritan Village. He is now a **missionary** in Africa and is getting married!

Safina was abandoned at a bus station by her mother. The police brought her to the orphanage at the age of three months. Safina just graduated from St. Augustine University with a degree in Journalism. She will complete her Master's Degree in 2026 and is also getting married soon.
