Our Mission: Samaritan Village is a private, non-profit organization in the US and a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) in Tanzania. The orphanage was established and is overseen by volunteers to develop, expand, and maintain e Christian orphanage that cares for abandoned, orphaned, and trafficked children.

Our Goal is to find a family to adopt the new child. For those children who are not adopted, Samaritan Village provides a safe and stable Christian home environment with many mamas and caregivers, even more brothers and sisters, and a father named Josephat (Our Director).

Our Medical Clinic: We opened a 24/7 Medical Clinic in 2019. The clinic is similar to an Urgent Care facility. It is staffed with doctors, nurses, midwives, a lab director, and a pharmacist. The cost is free for children and is offered at no cost or low cost for community members. In addition to routine medical care, the clinic provides prenatal and postnatal care and labor and delivery.





Safina was abandoned at a bus station after her mother told some other passengers who were waiting that she had to use the restroom and would be right back. She never returned. The police were called, and Safina was brought to the



orphanage at the age of three months. Safina is now an incredible young woman. She's intelligent with a free spirit and personality with attitude.

Safina just graduated with her bachelor's degree in Mass Communications. She is now pursuing a Master's Degree in Leadership and Government.

She just announced her engagement to a wonderful young man. They are having an engagement party while our team is visiting the orphanage at the end of

December.

Moses was the child of a prostitute. His mother attempted to abort him through medicines/drugs. She obviously failed. For the first month after he was born, she would leave the child every night so she could keep working. Finally, the neighborhood began reporting her to the authorities because the baby

would cry every night and was not supervised. Eventually, they called social welfare and the police. They found Moses nailed inside a box with only two holes for air. He had gone without food for days and was taken to the hospital suffering from malnutrition. Authorities searched for a long time, but they never found the mother.

Moses graduated from Bible College. He is now a missionary to the Maasai Tribe. He recently announced his engagement to an amazing young woman. He recently had her meet his family at Samaritan Village. He's now preparing to meet her family, which is no doubt much smaller than his!

board certification. We waited in anticipation as he


prepared over the past several months. Well, all that studying paid off, and he passed every exam!

The older children will also do community service for widows in need in the local area.


